Our work experience placements have been developed to support residents from a range of backgrounds and with different levels of ability.

### Your role

Classroom Support (Alternative Provision)

### What you'll be doing

You'll be working in a dedicated team, supporting and providing positive mentoring to young people who have various barriers to learning. These students may also have complex educational needs, and / or behavioural issues.

### Specific duties

Your duties will include:

- assisting with classroom support for small learner groups
- supporting individual learners as directed by the tutor
- supporting learners to develop their employability skills as part of their programme
- attending meetings and carrying out development activities as agreed with the coordinator
- supporting staff to prepare teaching materials

### Experience and skills you'll get

At the end of the placement you'll have:

- experience of supporting young learners
- experience of working for a local authority in a team environment
- improved confidence and work ethics
- experience of preparing teaching materials
- experience of using work-based ICT packages
