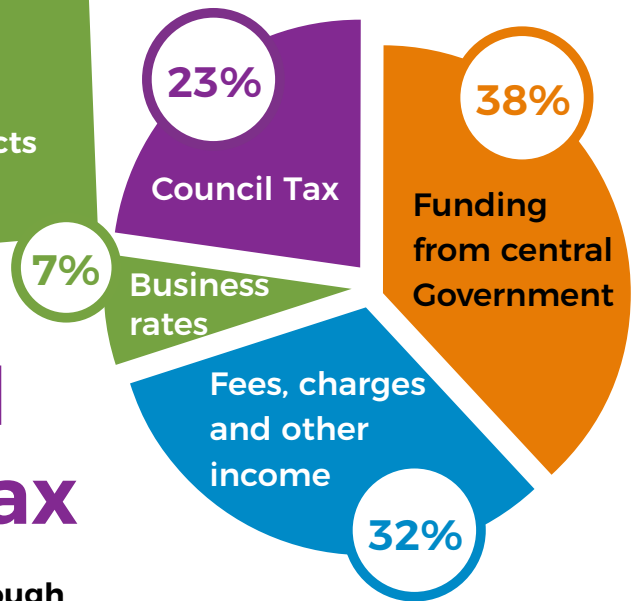




Where our money comes from

How we spend your Council Tax

The average Council Tax per household in Middlesbrough remains the lowest in the Tees Valley and is spent as follows:



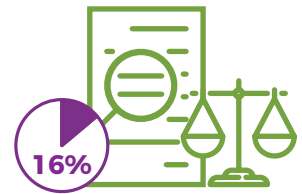
Adult Social Care & Health Integration - Delivering care and support to 11,159 older and vulnerable adults.



Children's Services - Safeguarding 2,595 local children and supporting families and school improvement.



Environment & Community Services - Collecting household waste, cleaning and maintaining our streets, parks and green spaces, maintaining Council buildings, maintaining the town's network of roads, footpaths and cycleways, and delivering community safety, libraries and community hubs.



Finance, Central Budgets, Legal & Governance Services - Meeting our legal and financial obligations, supporting local democracy and funding our investments.



Public Health & Public Protection - Improving public health, public protection and providing local leisure facilities via a leisure trust.



Regeneration and Culture - Delivering planning, regeneration, transport planning, and providing our museums, entertainment venues and other cultural activities.



Some of your Council Tax goes towards the funding of both the Fire Brigade and Police to help keep our communities safe.
