HOW TO GET EQUIPMENT

Occupational Therapist (OT) Adult Social Care

The Council's Occupational Therapy Teams can visit you at home to provide advice on carrying out daily tasks. They will see if you need equipment such as hoists, grab rails, specialist cutlery, etc and possibly adaptations to your home such as banisters or ramps. Independent Living Centre

The Independent Living Centre is a resource and advice centre. It has a range of equipment and daily living aids available for you to look at.

Teesside Community Equipment Service (TCES)

TCES is an equipment loan store operating across the Tees area.

Equipment may be offered to you following an assessment to promote daily living. This could be:

- Raised toilet seat
- Toilet frame
- Chair or bed raiser
- Mobility aids

Your GP can refer you to the Wheelchair Service at James Cook University Hospital which can provide a wheelchair or a scooter for you.

They can provide information about repairs and maintenance. They can also demonstrate to you and your family how to push, dismantle, fold and to put your wheelchair into a car.
