

Taking asbestos waste to the Household Waste and Recycling Centre at Haverton Hill.

Residents should be aware of their responsibilities when transporting and disposing of asbestos waste:

Make sure all asbestos and work related waste; including masks, overalls, cloths and plastic sheets, is **double** bagged. Asbestos waste **must** be packed in heavy duty plastic sacks; that is, UN (United Nations) approved packaging for the carriage of dangerous goods (5H3, 5H4, 5L3, 5M1, 5M2 graded bags) that are sealed with duct tape/parcel tape (no sellotape) and clearly labelled as asbestos waste. Asbestos cement products must be double wrapped in 1000 gauge polythene sheeting, labelled as above and sealed with duct tape/ parcel tape. **Please note that black bin liner sacks and carrier bags are NOT suitable for bagging any asbestos waste.**

**You should:**

- Report to a member of staff on arrival with your asbestos waste.
- Ensure your wrapped asbestos can be easily managed on site and you bring the necessary resources to be able to carry it.
- Do not overfill bags and when loading your vehicle be aware of any sharp objects that may puncture the sheets/bags/tears to the packaging. Any tears must be sealed with duct/parcel tape. No sellotape
- Please note a member of staff will inspect your asbestos waste to ensure it has been correctly bagged/wrapped and sealed. It will be recorded into the site log.
- Please note any non-conforming loads will be turned away from the site so don't waste a trip – get it right first time.
- Please note you will not be allowed to wrap asbestos whilst on the site – it is not permitted
- Remember your asbestos waste needs to be **double** wrapped. Bags must be sealed with strong tape i.e duct tape/parcel tape and clearly labelled.
